Everything we need ...to remember well

2 Peter 3:1-10

The emphasis we can see through these verses is that of **remembering well**. Remembrance is so important.

1. Remember you are loved v.1 *'dear friends' or dearly loved.*

The love the Father has for you

The love for one another in God's amazing family.

2. Remember the scriptures v.2

The Old Testament

The Gospels

The Epistles

3. Remember Jesus is returning v.3-4 *'in the last days...where is this coming' he promised.'*

Rev 22.12 *'Look I am coming soon. Amen, Come Lord Jesus.'*

Promised by Christ

Propheesied by Angels

Preached by Apostles

Proclaimed by Scriptures

Promoted by Creedal statements

Jesus is returning – personally, publicly, powerfully, purposefully.

4. Remember there are deceivers v.3-7

5. Remember Your God v.8-9

God is infinite – Psalm 90.4

God is patient – Psalm 103.8

God is loving – I John 4.8-10

God is just – Deuteronomy 32.4, Psalm 89.14

6. Remember – New Heavens and New Earth v.10

Questions for reflection and discussion in Growth Groups:

1. In what ways is the theme of remembrance important for us as Christians? What verses come to mind that underline the theme of remembrance in our lives?
2. Why do so many struggle with the whole area of being deeply loved by God or by one another? What hymn or song comes to mind that can stir us to a greater realisation of such love?
3. What helps you to understand more of the scriptures – share some of the helps you have come to value?
4. How should we be living in the light of Jesus' second coming? Rev 22.12 offers a promise and a prayer – is that something that stirs your own heart? The deceivers mocked the idea of Christ coming again – what was their argument?
5. Take encouragement from the unchanging nature of God – who is infinite, patient, loving and just. What stands out for you?
6. How do you understand the events that will take place when Christ returns? Remember that there are different perspectives even in the interpretation of scripture within your group!
7. What has stirred you to 'wholesome thinking'(v.1) in this study?
